Colegio Panamericano is a progressive, non-profit educational community with a global perspective offering both Colombian and U.S diplomas. Our rigorous curriculum and exemplary faculty empower students to develop their intellectual, physical, and ethical potentials in preparation for a quality university education and a successful life.

OVERVIEW

In 1962, a group of members representing the community of Bucaramanga, decided to organize a school for the dissemination of bilingual and international education. Colegio Panamericano was formalized and the Ministry of Education granted it a license to operate on October 24, **1963**.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

In Upper School, students are challenged with engaging courses and projects that are interdisciplinary and based upon real-life problems and solutions. Our teachers work as a collaborative team in order to create a learning environment that both embraces and enhances students academic and social skills. Upper School is dedicated to ensuring students are prepared for the future, having gained the knowledge and skills required to be successful whether they choose to study in Colombia or elsewhere worldwide.

- Colegio Panamericano **received its first cognia certification in 1994**. We were the first to obtain it in the region and we have been the only ones for more than 25 years.
- In November 2018, Colegio Panamericano became the first school in South America to have its STEAM program certified by **Cognia.**
- We are the only institution authorized by the **College Board** in Santander to take international tests.
- **Project-based learning** is embedded throughout the curriculum, and most courses engage students in long-term investigative projects, which often address local issues affecting the community.
- Our curriculum is taugh 80% in english and 20% in spanish.
- Our students graduate with a **double degree**, both Colombian and American.
- All students complete a community service of 80 hours, its a requirement before graduating.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Biology, Physics, Calculus, Precalculus, Chemistry, Microeconómics, Human Geography, Computer Science Principles, Spanish Literature, Psychology, Studio Art and Statistics.

AP Courses are open to **Grade 10° (2 Subjects), Grade 11° (4 Subjects), and Grade 12° (4 Subjects)**. On average **71%** of graduates complete at least one AP course.
